Role of a School Liaison

School Liaisons are the communication link between the family, school, and medical team.

School Liaisons work closely with the child's teacher to:

- provide staff and peers with information about the child's diagnosis
- help get needed school services for the child

More about the program

The School Intervention Program:

- provides access to education services during and following treatment
- supports the child's continued involvement in daily activities
- prevents or minimizes future educational problems related to medical absences, diagnosis, and/or treatment

More about the program

School Liaisons:

- improve the communication between the child's medical and educational teams, helping to make a smoother transition back to school and home
- strive to improve the child's quality of life during and following treatment

Need help?

Medical team members can refer patients for School Intervention services.

Target age groups include patients in pre-school through post-secondary transitions (college, a training program, or employment).
